Things you need to know about applying for admission

UA ADMISSIONS

The University of Alabama is committed to supporting the aspirations of its students. That dedication is reflected in an educational experience that demonstrates an unwavering pledge to teaching excellence, the advancement of scholarship, and service to society.

Freshman admissions

The University of Alabama employs a competitive admission process that includes reviewing and evaluating each application on an individual basis for an applicant's abilities as a student and a scholar. Decisions about the potential for your academic success at UA are based on your performance on the ACT and/or SAT, your high-school grade point average, and your high-school course schedule. (For example: a student with a 20 ACT or 950 SAT along with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 should be successful at the University.) We are looking for students that show a commitment to academics. Typically, the number of applications received exceeds the number of spaces available in the freshman class.

Freshman admissions review decision factors

In terms of educational preparation, the college preparatory curriculum minimum unit requirements for regular admissions are

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of social science, including world history or a comparable course
- 3 units of mathematics (must include algebra I, algebra II, and one unit of either geometry, trigonometry, or calculus)
- 3 units of natural science, including two courses with laboratory components
- 1 unit of a foreign language
- 5 units of academic courses

Students that exceed the minimum number of units in math, natural sciences, or foreign language will be given additional consideration.

The Advanced Academic Diploma awarded by Alabama high schools meets all University of Alabama course requirements.

ADMISSION PROCESS FOR FRESHMEN

Admission Guidelines

- Complete the printed University of Alabama application for admission and return it with a check or money order for \$35 made payable to The University of Alabama (see address on the first page of the application). Or, you may apply online at apply.ua.edu for a \$30 fee. The application fee is nonrefundable.
 - Have your ACT or SAT score(s) sent to us. Our ACT code is 0052 and our SAT code is 1830. Information on these tests is available from your high-school counselor or from the test services: ACT, act.org; SAT, collegeboard.com.
 - Have your most recent official high-school transcript sent to us along with official transcripts from any other high school(s) attended (see address on the first page of the application).
 - Complete all of the preceding steps by **February 1** for priority consideration.

Transfer Admissions Requirements

Admission to The University of Alabama as a transfer student is based on the grade point average earned for your college coursework, excluding technical and remedial classes. A transfer applicant must have a grade point average of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale on all coursework attempted and must be eligible to return to his or her current institution. Transfer applicants who will have earned fewer than 24 semester hours (36 quarter hours) at the time they enroll at the University must also meet freshman admission standards.

ADMISSION PROCESS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Admission Guidelines

- Complete the printed University of Alabama application for admission and return it with a check or money order for \$35 made payable to The University of Alabama (see address on the first page of the application). Or, you may apply online at apply.ua.edu for a \$30 fee. The application fee is nonrefundable.
- If you will have earned fewer than 24 semester hours (36 quarter hours) at the time of application, have your high-school transcript and ACT or SAT score(s) sent to us (see address on the first page of the application). Our ACT code is 0052 and our SAT code is 1830.
- During your final term of work at your present college, have each collegiate institution you have attended forward one official transcript to The University of Alabama, Office of Academic Records and University Registrar, Box 870134, Tuscaloosa, AL 35487-0134. When you have been admitted, those transcripts will be evaluated by your academic division to determine how many credits can be applied to UA degree requirements.
- Complete all of the preceding steps by **June 1** for priority consideration.

If there is a break of more than one term in your educational history, submit a statement of activity.

The University of Alabama reserves the right to refuse admission or re-enrollment or to place conditions on admission or re-enrollment of applicants and former students who it determines represent a safety risk to University students, employees, and University property. Applicants have the right to appeal any such decision to the Undergraduate Admissions Appeal Committee within seven business days of the date the notice was received.

DON'T FORGET...

- **For admission:** Submit the first and second pages of the printed application for admission, the \$35 application fee, and any required documents to Undergraduate Admissions (see address on application) by **February 1** for high-school seniors and **June 1** for transfer students for priority consideration.
- **For scholarships:** A completed scholarship application, including the résumé portion, must be submitted online by **December 1** for high school seniors and **January 15** for transfer students for priority consideration. Find the application at <http://scholarships.ua.edu/2008>.
- **For financial aid:** You must be admitted to UA, have the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) completely processed, and have submitted any required documents to Student Financial Aid by **March 1** for priority consideration.
- **For health services:** Submit the Medical History Form and proof of immunization to Student Health Center (see address on form) immediately upon admission to UA.
- **For housing:** Complete the residence hall application (see the online application at housing.ua.edu) and submit the \$250 deposit to Housing and Residential Communities by **April 1** for preferred consideration. More information about on-campus living and the online application are available at housing.ua.edu.
- **For meal plans:** First-year students will choose their dining plan as part of the housing application process. All other students visit bamadining.com to purchase the meal plan option that fits your schedule. Please contact the Bama Dining office for guidance, questions, or recommendations.
